Step 1 - Necessary documents for application submission:

1. Passport or ID
2. Educational documents (high school, A level, Level 3 etc.)
3. CV & Personal Statement - 300 words

Step 2 - Assessments:

Interview consists of 2 parts:

1. Written 15 minutes
2. Oral 5 minutes (Face to Face) **Very important** to read the Course Overview and show how motivated you are.

English Exam consists of 4 parts:

1. Reading
2. Listening
3. Writing 300 Words
4. Speaking

Step 3 - Results are issued within 2 to 4 days. Upon successful results, applicant will receive their Unconditional Offer Letter.

Step 4 - Registration (online & in campus)

Classes will be held **2 days a week** chosen by University, 6 hours per day - from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

Evenings: Tuesday 6pm-9pm - Thursday 6pm-9pm and Saturday 10am-5pm

Various intakes are available throughout the year.

All applicants must be between 18-55 years of age.

English level must be upper intermediate.

ADDITIONAL BENEFITS:

30% oyster discount. 15% to 25% discount on purchases in stores, movies, theatres etc.,

Student Finance:

Tuition Fee Loan - The money is received directly by the university to cover the cost of your course.

All EU applicants are eligible for tuition fees subject to have 3 years of European residency history.

Maintenance Loan: Between £12000-£20000 (depending on circumstances of the applicant).

Eligibility:

Have lived in the UK for 5 or more years.

If less than 5 years, then applicant will be considered as a **Migrant Worker** and need to fulfill the following:

1. To provide last 3 months pay slips

2. To provide last months bank statements
3. To work 16+ hours per week
4. Work contract or tax returns and invoices if self-employed

Childcare Grant & Parents' Learning Allowance

In academic year 2017/18 and 2018/19 you can receive up to 85% of your childcare costs up to a maximum of £161.50 a week for one child; or £274.55 a week for two or more children.

Loan Repayment:

How much will I repay?

You'll repay 9% of your income above the repayment threshold. The repayment threshold is expected to change to £25,725 a year, £2,143 a month or £494 a week from 6 April 2019.

Here are some examples of what your monthly repayments might be:

Income each year before tax	Student loan monthly repayment
£25,725	£0
£27,000	£9
£29,500	£28
£31,000	£39
£33,000	£54

For all **POSTGRADUATE** courses you will get a maximum of **£ 10,000** per year. If the course costs less, you can keep the difference.
